

Minutes of the 52nd Annual General Meeting The University of Alberta, March 27, 2010

The meeting was called to order at 4:30 pm, Viaud President/Chair, Goehring recording the minutes.

4. Student Travel Allocation

- Motion 4.1. As the student numbers in attendance at the conference are unknown at the time of the AGM, student travel allocations shall be determined by the WDCAG Executive by e-mail correspondence by at a later date and shall follow the formula used in 2009. (Windsor/Smith)
- Motion 4.2. That the travel allowance for 2010 be capped at \$4,500.00.

The WDCAG Executive voted by email on April 12 and 13 to unanimously accept the following distribution. This distribution follows the formula used in 2009, and is based on a multiplier of number of students times distance travelled, and proportionally dividing up the official travel money allocation of \$4,500. 5. Reports

a. Secretary/Treasurer (Jiskoot/Viaud)

Written report and statement submitted by Jiskoot (presented by Viaud). Accounts remain operated by Financial Services at the University of Lethbridge. The balance as of March 22, 2010 is \$9,697.52. Once the printing and mailing costs associated with the publishing of the Western Geography are added, the balance in the WDCAG account will be \$7,901.51. (Windor/Hawein)

b. Western Geography (Hanlon/Windsor)

Written report submitted by Hanlon, Editor (presented by Windsor). Volumes 17/18/19 (collected as one volume) were published online in December of 2009 and printed and distributed in text (315 copies) February/March 2010. A call for papers for Volume 20 has been distributed. It was noted that the Western Division is now the only regional division of the Canadian Association of Geographers that publishes its own journal. Two suggestions were entertained in discussion. The first was that the concept of "themed" editions be considered in the future. The second was that the Western Division approach the Prairie Division with the possibility of collaboration on future editions of the Western Geographer. (Windsor/Evenden)

c. Newsletter (Beaney)

Written report submitted by Beaney. No newsletter was produced last year due to her extended maternity leave. Two editions of the newsletter will be produced this year (spring and fall). All member departments will be contacted soon for updated contact information. (Beaney/Viaud)

d. BC Education Chair (McVey)

Written report submitted by McVey (presented by Viaud). In BC, enrolment in Geography 12 has dropped by 25% from 2002/2003 to 2008/2009. McVey conveyed some concern and frustration as to these trends. He recommends that each Department of Geography in BC should make a determined effort to liaise with their local geography high schools teachers. He has requested to step down as Chair, but is willing to remain on the committee to work with the new Chair. (Viaud/Windsor)

Other than the addition of newsletters, program and some advertising associated with the Annual General Meeting in Nanaimo in 2009, the status of the Archives has remained the same as in the previous year at this time. It was suggested that the WDCAG Archivist establishes contact with the new archivist in charge of the storage at SFU.
