President's Report – Theresa Garvin WDCAG Annual General Meeting. Kelowna, BC March 8-10, 2012

Last year's meeting, hosted by our colleagues from Simon Fraser University was a great success with almost 265 participants, making it one of the larger WDCAG meetings in recent years (Vancouver Island was only slightly larger at 275). Of those participants, almost 150 were students and the Division distributed a total of \$2000 in funds to support student participation. Funding was capped at \$2000 due to a one-year reduction in CAG Travel Allocation and Division Rebates in 2010 and 11. Travel funds were also limited to those students travelling from outside the Lower Mainland of BC. The J.L. Robinson Award for Meritorious Service to the WDCAG was awarded to Dr. Dan Smith of University of Victoria, the J.A. McVey Award for Teaching Excellence and W.C. Wonders Award for Scholarly Distinction were not awarded.

As WDCAG President I attended my first CAG Executive Meeting at the Annual Meeting in Calgary in May, 2011. The bulk of the executive meeting time was taken up by a discussion of the renegotiation of the publishing contract for the organization's journal, *The Canadian Geographer*. The final decision on the contract was made by the executive in September 2011 and a five year contract was secured with Wiley Blackwell to continue publishing the journal until 2014.

As we have transitioned over the past year from one president to another, I would like to thank Gilles Viaud (Thompson Rivers University) for his excellent leadership between 2008 and 2010. As some of you may know, we have recently experienced a loss of continuity and it was Gilles that had to deal with the bulk of the challenges related to our Division's lack of paper trail over the past two years (see more on this below). As a result Gilles learned much of his duties on-the-fly and is to be commended on leading the Division over this time. We are thankful for his leadership and wish him all the best.

As alluded to above, the much of my time as president over the past year has been spent trying to reconstruct the lost paperwork of our Division. At present we seem to be missing almost all written documentation between 2003 and 2009. If there is anyone in the Division that might have copies of agendas or minutes from these years, please send them to me. I have recently been in touch with Dan Smith at University of Victoria who is our webmaster about the possibility of providing an electronic archive of Agendas, Minutes, and Conference Materials via the website. He has informed me that this is easily done, therefore this matter has been added to the agenda for this year's meeting.

Finally, one of the most important problems arising from the loss of paperwork is that our constitution is outdated. The online version has no date attached, but is clearly a much earlier version and changes seem to have been made between the online version and the most recent copy (2001) that I was able to find. Therefore it is probably best that we revisit recent constitutional changes at the annual meeting, provide evidence of legal acceptance of the revisions, and ensure that the online copy of our constitution is up to date.
